

### WHAT GOES IN YOUR BLUE RECYCLE CART

April 2023

Aluminum Cans & Trays, Plastic Bottles, Jugs & Tubs, Glass Bottles & Jars, Newspapers, Ads, Magazines, Junk Mail Paper, Cardboard, Cereal Boxes, Cartons, Metal Cans, etc.



Garden Hoses, Ropes, Dirty Papers, Diapers, Paper Plates, Paper Towels, Napkins, Paper Coffee Cups, Plastic bags/wraps, Pet Waste, Kitty Litter, Food Waste, Garden Trimmings, etc.



# RECYCLE THESE!

The items below are recyclable through the City of Victorville Recycling Program. Place these materials in your blue recycling cart or white recycling dumpster (for apartment/condo/mobile home complexes). All materials should be clean, dry, and loose—no plastic bags.



#### **METAL CANS & FOIL**

Aluminum cans, tin cans, pie tins, aluminum foil, and EMPTY aerosol cans.



#### **What About CRV?**

Keep CRV beverage containers separate from your other recyclables, then redeem CRV for cash at a local buy-back recycle center. OR, just put CRV in with other recyclables in your recycling bin and they will be recycled through the City program.

#### **GLASS BOTTLES & JARS**

Food and beverage bottles and jars only.



#### **PLASTIC BOTTLES, JARS TUBS & TRAYS**

Any solid plastic bottles, jars, tubs, or trays. Includes yogurt, juice, milk, shampoo, soda, water, or detergent bottles.



#### **PAPER & CARDBOARD**

Clean/dry paper, newspapers, cereal boxes, magazines, junk mail, cardboard boxes, phone books, school papers.

NO Sharps/Needles Take to Household Haz Waste Center.

NO Hoses, Holiday Lights, or other "Tanglers." Put in trash.



**NO Electronics.** Take to Recycling Drop-off Center.

# Victorville Goes GREEN with **Organics**

**NEW RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM Starting Summer 2023** 

City of Victorville residents will receive a new GREEN cart to recycle ORGANICS.



The GREEN cart is for garden trimmings and food scraps.

The BLUE cart is still for recyclables — paper, cardboard, glass bottles, plastic containers, and tin/aluminum cans.

> The BLACK cart is for trash like plastic bags and wrap, old clothing, diapers, and pet waste.

Note: If your house still has a green cart for trash, that cart will be replaced with a new black cart. You will also receive a new green cart for organics.

Recycling organics reduces landfill disposal. This reduces methane emissions AND saves valuable resources. The organic materials will be turned into COMPOST which is used by farmers to enrich the soil. CA state law SB 1383 requires all CA cities and towns to implement programs to recycle organic materials and reduce landfilling.

### California Senate Bill 1383

### **Mandatory Recycling of Organic Materials**

#### **WHAT IS SENATE BILL 1383**

Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) is a law enacted by the State of California in 2016 to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by diverting organic wastes from landfill.

SB 1383 requires all businesses and residents to divert organic materials (such as food waste, garden trimmings, and non-hazardous wood waste) from the landfill. Starting January 1, 2022, State regulations to implement the law went into effect. The law also requires the state to increase edible food recovery by 20% by 2025.

#### **WHAT IS CITY ORDINANCE # 2425**

SB 1383 regulations required all CA jurisdictions to enact ordinances to mandate the recycling of organic waste. In response, the City of Victorville adopted Ordinance # 2425 on April 19, 2022. This ordinance added Chapter 6.37 ("Mandatory Organic Waste Disposal Reduction") to the Victorville Municipal Code. Chapter 6.37 requires residential (including multi-family complexes) and commercial customers to recycle organic materials.

# WHAT ORGANICS RECYCLING PROGRAMS ARE THERE FOR BUSINESSES?

The City has already implemented programs to collect food scraps, garden trimmings, and non-hazardous wood waste from Victorville businesses. Multi-family complexes are provided with garden trimming collection. Food scrap collection for multi-family complexes will start later in 2023.

WHEN WILL RESIDENTIAL ORGANICS COLLECTION START?

Residential organics collection for food scraps and garden trimmings is expected to start in mid-2023. Residents will receive a 3rd GREEN cart to use for recycling organic materials. Multi-family complexes will also have food scrap service available.

#### **HOW CAN I RECYCLE ORGANICS NOW?**

The City has a free garden trimming drop-off program for City residents. You can also start a backyard composting pile for your garden trimmings and fruit/vegetable scraps. Call the Environmental Programs Division at 760-955-8615 for more information.

## **PROTECT YOUR HOME & THE ENVIRONMENT**

FOG (Fats, oils and grease) is a byproduct of cooking. It comes from meat, lard, oil, shortening, butter, margarine, food scraps, baking goods, sauces and dairy products.

When grease washes down the sink, it sticks to the insides of the pipes that connect your home or business to the City's sewer. Eventually, the grease can build up until it completely blocks sewer pipes. That can create difficult and expensive maintenance problems for both the City and homeowners.

Garbage disposals don't keep grease out of sewer pipes. Products that claim to dissolve grease may dislodge a blockage, but is temporary until the grease hardens again!

## **HOW YOU CAN HELP!**

- Don't pour grease down sink drains or toilets.
- Scrape grease and food scraps into the trash.
- Or, pour grease into tin cans, let it harden and throw in the trash.
- Catch food scraps & other solids with a strainer in the sink drain, and empty the strainer into the trash.
- Remember, your garbage disposal is not a trash can. Try to minimize its use.

## PLEASE DISPOSE OF WASTE PROPERLY

Only human waste and toilet paper should go down the toilet. When other items are flushed down the toilet, sewer overflows can occur. Sewer overflows can cause health problems, property damage and threaten the environment.

All of these items should be put in the trash except for Sharps & Medicines.

\*Sharps and Medicines should not be put in the trash but should be taken to the **Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center** .

## **NO DRUGS DOWN THE DRAIN!**

Once it was common practice to flush expired medications down the toilet. We now know that some of these substances are bad for our environment. They can get into surface waters, soils, and groundwater.




The federal government has released new guidelines for disposal of pills.

### **HOW TO DISPOSE OF UNUSED PILLS**

- Remove all personal information from containers.
- Place the medicine in an empty can or sealable bag.
- Seal the container and take it to the HHW Center.
- Always keep medicines away from the drain, children and pets.
- Expired medications can be dropped off at the HHW Collection Center (See address on the back)

## PROTECT YOUR SEWER SYSTEM FROM OVERFLOWS



Care & maintenance of the private sewer line is the homeowner's responsibility. Regular cleaning is essential to keep the waste flowing!

## IN CASE OF A BLOCK...

If your lateral line is blocked, it's your responsibility to find the cause and remove the blockage. Most licensed plumbers provide services to clear a lateral.

If the licensed plumber determines that the blockage is caused by the City's portion of the line, immediately contact the Public Works Department at (760) 241-6365.

Personnel will be dispatched to investigate.
