

The EcoHero Show environmental education program centers around a 45 minute assembly called "The EcoHero Show." A few CRV Recycling Tips...

To find a CRV buy back center, go to www.BottlesAndCans.com and enter your zip code.

To make recycling CRV easy:

- Make sure bottles and cans are complete empty—no liquids!
- CRV includes most beverage containers (soda, beer, water, juice, wine/hard liquor bottles/cans).
- Make sure to sort CRV by material type: aluminum cans; plastic (soda type) bottles; glass bottles; large
 water jugs, etc. The buy-back center will require the bottles and cans to be sorted by material type. It's
 much easier to separate at the start, rather than mixing everything together and trying to sort at the
 recycling center.

WHO MAY ENTER?

All student groups comprised of K-12 students in public, private, and home schools within Victorville city limits are eligible. Videos must be filmed and created by a student group.

IDENTIFICATION & PERMISSION SLIP

All student groups must turn in an approved entry form for their video and permission forms for each student under age 18 that appears in their video. Entry forms and permission forms should be turned in with your school's Final Report Form on Monday, December 2, 2024.

DESIGN THEME

Videos can cover any aspect of "Recycling and Organics Recycling in the City of Victorville." Possible ideas include (1) why recycling is important, (2) how recycling helps the environment, (3) "call to action" message encouraging participation in the City of Victorville's recycling programs, and/or (4) explanation of what items can go into recycling and organics recycling containers.

VIDEO SPECIFICATIONS

- Videos must be at least 1 minute long but no more than 4 minutes long.
- All videos must be original. Videos taken by anyone other than the student group whose name appears on the video contest entry form will be disqualified.
- Copyrighted characters, such as Superman, or logos, such as sports team's logos, should not be included in the videos. The use of lettering, numbering, or a school logo in any language in the video is not allowed with the exception of the City of Victorville logo.
- Music, humor, and acting are all encouraged to make the message more fun and appealing.

DEADLINE & JUDGING

Videos must be uploaded by Monday, December 2, 2024. Finalist videos will be evaluated to determine if each meets the minimum requirements and a judging committee will select the Grand Prize video.

GRAND PRIZE WINNER

The Grand Prize student group video will win a cash prize for their school. Winning video and other honorable mentions may be posted on the City website: www.VictorvilleCA.gov and/or city social media sites.

WHO MAY ENTER?

All K-12 students in public, private, and home schools within Victorville city limits are eligible. No group posters will be accepted. A poster may only be submitted by a single artist. On the back of the poster, please write the artist's name, grade, teacher, and school name.

POSTERS WILL BE GROUPED IN ONE OF THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES:

• Kindergarten - 3rd Grade • 4th- 6th Grade • 7th- 12th Grade

POSTER SPECIFICATIONS

- Posters must be 11X17
- Poster paper can be provided upon request, please email Sandy Peña at spena@burrtec.com for more information.
- Poster theme should relate to recycling, composting, protecting the earth, litter cleanup, making a difference; references to Victorville are encouraged.
- All artwork must be original. Copyrighted characters, such as Superman, or copyrighted clip art, or copyright-free clip art will not be accepted.
- Any media may be used with the exception of glitter.
- Three-dimensional entries will not be accepted. Nothing may be glued, stapled, or attached to the artwork in any way. Framed, matted, or laminated artwork will not be accepted. The use of lettering, numbering, or a school logo in any language on the front of the poster is not allowed with the exception of the City of Victorville logo.
- Stenciled, traced, computer-generated, or commercially manufactured stick-on lettering or graphics is prohibited.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Clear message conveyed by the text and artwork.
- 2. The poster theme is addressed.
- 3. Creativity, originality and artistic quality.
- 4. Visual Clarity- easily read.
- 5. Bright and colorful.

The best posters in each category will be judged based on the criteria listed above. First, Second, and Third placed will be awarded cash prizes. Honorable mentions will be chosen and awarded non-cash prizes.

DELIVERY

Folded posters will not be accepted. Artwork should be packed and wrapped flat. Please read the poster contest rules carefully, as only posters that meet the contest rules will be considered. Deliver your school's posters to the following address.

SCULPTURE CONTEST Due Monday, December 2, 2024

WHO MAY ENTER?

All K-12 students in public, private, and home schools within Victorville city limits are eligible.

Your sculpture should be grouped in one of the following two categories for judging: Individuals or teams may create sculptures. No student may have an entry in both divisions.

• Kindergarten- 6th Grade • 7th- 12th Grade

DESIGN THEME/GUIDELINES

- 1. Sculptures can be any theme at all: they just need to showcase the creative use of recycled materials. Sculptures can be abstract or represent actual objects or scenes.
- 2. Glue, tape, string, wire, and thread are permitted. Hot glued is recommended.
- 3. Maximum size of 2 feet wide by 2 feet long by 2 feet tall and be self-supporting able to stand on their own when displayed. If the sculpture must hang, the hanging mechanism must be supplied – nothing can hang on the walls. Please do not use wood for the base - makes structure very heavy to transport.
- 4. The majority of items used for your sculpture must be common household recyclables such as aluminum cans, junk mail, tin cans, steel cans, plastics #1-#7, newspaper, cardboard, and cereal boxes. Absolutely no alcoholic beverage or tobacco product containers or packaging.
- 5. Judges will want to see the actual recyclables and other materials used in the sculpture. Painted recyclables cannot be properly recycled after the competition.
- 6. The following information should be attached to the sculpture on a 3 x 5 card: Artist's name(s), school's name, Grade(s), classroom teacher.

PRIZES

The sculptures will be judged on creativity and best use of recycled materials. First, Second, and Third placed will be awarded cash prizes. Honorable mentions will be chosen and awarded non-cash prizes.

SCULPTURE DELIVERY

Each school's sculptures should be received no later than Monday, December 2, 2024, at 4:00 p.m. City hall hours are Monday -Thursday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Friday 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Please have arrangements for delivery firmly in place. You may have to ask a parent to make the sculpture delivery. Deliver your school's sculptures to the following address:
