Keep CRV beverage containers separate from your other recyclables, then redeem CRV for cash at a local buy-back recycle center. OR, just put CRV in with other recyclables in your recycling bin and they will be recycled through the City program.

Food and beverage bottles and jars only.



## PLASTIC BOTTLES, JARS TUBS & TRAYS

Any solid plastic bottles, jars, tubs, or trays. Includes yogurt, juice, milk, shampoo, soda, water, or detergent bottles.



#### **PAPER & CARDBOARD**

Clean/dry paper, newspapers, cereal boxes, magazines, junk mail, cardboard boxes, phone books, school papers.

## Recycling In Victorville | Did You Know?

Recycling is mandatory per the Victorville Municipal Code (VMC) Chapter 6.36. "Designated Recyclable Materials" are required to be kept separate from trash. It is a violation of the VMC to place recyclables in the trash container. Recyclables materials includes all clean, dry paper and cardboard, glass bottles and jars, tin and aluminum cans, and rigid plastic containers (bottles, jars, tubs, cups, and trays).

Victorville residents and businesses recycled 8,577 tons through the Curbside Recycling and Commercial Recycling Programs in 2018, saving over \$320,000 in landfill disposal costs. Those disposal savings are passed along to residents and businesses in the form of lower monthly solid waste charges.

Household batteries are considered "Universal Waste" and it is illegal to dispose of them in the trash or recycle bins. They can cause fires in trash trucks and at recycling processing centers. Safely dispose of your household batteries for FREE at the City of Victorville Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center, located on Loves Lane, off of Desert Knoll Drive, behind the County Fairgrounds. The HHWCC is open every Wednesday and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
