#### THE LIBRARIAN'S CORNER

The Victorville City Library has eliminated overdue fines/ late fees on all materials except for Movies and Video Games for all library users. The City Library is joining 11 other library districts in Southern California that are either completely or partially fine free. This move ensures that the City Library is providing free and equitable access to information, knowledge, learning and the joys of reading for our diverse community.

While the Library eliminated overdue fines, library users are still responsible for the cost associated with the replacement of lost or damaged books and other materials they check out. In the past, library users had to pay both a fine (a daily penalty) and a fee (a lump sum to cover replacement costs) if they lost a book. This prevented library users who owed the library from checking out new items, and in some cases, from feeling comfortable visiting the library.

This also means that previous overdue fines accrued on patron accounts will be waived. The library staff anticipates that many library patrons will welcome the change and more people will start using the library as overdue fines/late fees will no longer be a barrier to enjoying library resources .Pick up a program calendar at the beginning of each month.

#### FROM THE FOL PRESIDENT

The Friends of the Library continue their monthly Book Sale. On the third Wednesday of the month you can fill a FOL cloth bag full of used books for only \$5. What a buy.

The main purpose, and the only pursue of the FOL, is to support the library. All monies from the book sales, and DVD rentals will be used for the library. In the past the FOL has purchased computers, furniture, printers, books, and any number of other things the library needed.

#### FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY BOOK CLUB


The Friend's monthly book club meets on the 1st Monday of even numbered months at 10:00 am in the Dbrary. Please join us for sort stimulating discussion.
