THE LIBRARIAN'S CORNER

For decades, libraries have utilized fines to discourage patrons from returning books late or not at all. But a growing number of libraries are eliminating overdue fees after finding that the penalties drive away the people who stand to benefit the most from free library resources.

In February, 2020, with support of the Friends of the Victorville City Library, the Victorville Library followed suit eliminating late fees to help the community and bring back patrons. The program has been helpful during the pandemic and has helped ease patrons concerns about overdue books during stay-at-home orders.

In January 2019 the American Library Association passed a resolution in which it recognizes fines as "a form of social inequity" and called on libraries nationwide to find a way to eliminate their fines.

"Library users with limited income tend to stay away from libraries because they may be afraid of incurring debt," said Ramiro Salazar, president of the Association's public library division. "It stands to reason these same users will also stay away if they have already incurred a fine simply because they don't have the money to pay the fine."

With the change in policy, the Victorville library is now counted among the few libraries in the State and nationally that have eliminated late fees, a fact that we can all be proud of.

LIBRARY MASTER PLAN UPDATE December, 2020

In 2019, the Victorville City Council appropriated funds to obtain the services of a consultant to conduct a Master Plan for Library Services for the City of Victorville.

The initial proposals did not satisfy the intended scope of the services desired. A new RFP (Request for Proposal) process was conducted, and 5 proposals were received in January, 2020.

The proposal from Godfrey's Associates was reviewed by staff and the Community Services Advisory Committee in February 2020 with the recommendation that the city accept the proposal from Godfrey's Associates.

Information is also being distributed about the consultant's community engagement points through a variety of means and through a variety of our community touch points. The final report is to be presented to the City Council in March 2021.

LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES

A Little Free Library is a "take a book, share a book" free book exchange. They come in many shapes and sizes, but the most common version is a small wooden box of books. Anyone may take a book or bring a book to share. Little Free Library book exchanges have a unique, personal touch.

There is an understanding that real people are sharing their favorite books with their community; little libraries have been called "mini-town squares."



Yes, anyone may contribute or take books. The more the merrier! If you take a book (or two) from a library, you do not need to return that exact book. However, in order to keep the little library full of good choices for the whole neighborhood, the next time you swing by the library bring a few books to share. Little Free Library book exchanges function on the honor system; everyone contributes to ensure there are always quality books inside. This way, we all win!
